To create a food security system in Arlington that works collaboratively to meet all residents needs for healthy and culturally appropriate food, in an affordable and dignified manner.





Types of Food Assistance Programs




Average Households Served Weekly




Distribution across Arlington

- Weekend options are counted under their time period and weekend.


Morning: 8am-12pm

Evening: 5pm – 8pm


Access to Key Food Groups

Percentage of Pickups at Which Clients Have Access to These Items "Always" or "Most of the Time"




Access to Food for Special Diets

Percentage of Pickups at Which Clients Have Access to These Items "Always" or "Most of the Time"




