Glossary

- **Individuals** any one person who demonstrates a need for food assistance programs. Multiple individuals may make up a household.
- Families/Households people who reside together, who share food resources and prepare meals together.
- **Food distributions** are events hosted by food pantries or social service organizations in which grocery items or meals are made available to individuals and/or families in need, free of charge.
- **Visits** A visit counts one household's use of a food distribution. Total visits count the total number of times food was distributed to households. A single household can have multiple visits during the time period (usually per quarter or month).
- **Eligible households** Households that qualify under requirements of the specified program.
